# A VERY SIMPLE CREAMSICLE

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THE TYPOGRAPHY IS THE MOST

STICK: CUT TWO OUT OF FELT  
CUT ONE OUT OF PLASTIC CANVAS/CARDBOARD

CUT ONE INSIDE OF  
DELICIOUS BITE!

TELL ON YOU!

OUTER EDGE: CUT ONE ON FOLD  
TO GET ONE LONG PIECE

## Tips and Instructions:

- ◆ If you have 9 x 12 pieces of felt rather than felt yardage, you may not be able to cut the side piece on the fold. Just cut two and sew them together, but make sure to cut a little extra for seam allowance!
- ◆ You can easily make a whole creamsicle that has not been partially devoured just by continuing the curve when you cut it out instead of cutting the bite. Don't forget to make the outer edge a couple of inches longer to make up for the lack of the inner bite piece!
- ◆ It's easiest if you first decorate the front with a face (if you want it to have a face) then sew the side all the way around. Make the stick, cut a slit in the bottom of the outer edge piece, slide the stick in, and then sew the stick to the 'sicle. Finally, sew the back on and stuff as you go, being sure to stuff around the front and back of the stick to hold it firmly.
- ◆ If you're going to be holding the 'sicle by the stick, you'll definitely need something to support it. Plastic canvas works but is still a little flimsy. Cardboard is probably better, but an actual popsicle stick would work the best, especially if you plan on letting a mini-me run around with it.
- ◆ Create the trademark orange creamsicle using orange felt for the 'sicle and outer edge with white felt for the inside of the bite. Vary the colors for a delicious selection of frozen treats!
